Pupil premium is additional money given to schools to support pupils who are considered disadvantaged.
In 2017 – 2018, Pupil premium was targeted at:

- Children Eligible for Free School Meals
- Looked After Children
- Children requiring additional pastoral support including children 'in need' or subject to child protection plans

Uniform provision	School uniform provided for those in most need.	£1000	Two families were supported in buying new uniform. Many families were supported through being given free second hand uniform. Pupils feel part of school community and are able to attend school events with the correct uniform, allowing them to be part of the school.
MEND	To contribute to pupils mental wellbeing, exercise, nutrition and general wellbeing.	£300	Pupils became more active through participation in MEND sessions, which also supported their mental health and wellbeing.
Mentoring programme	Children involved in team building activities working with each other to support learning.	£500	12 key focus children across the school took part in mentoring team building sessions. This supported their approach to learning in the classroom and how to work with each other. Increased confidence and self-esteem were also developed through this.
