

Year 1 learning from home

Dear parents/carers,

The Government have worked with schools across the country to create a set of daily lessons in English, Maths and another foundation subject. This initiative is called the Oak National Academy. The Government is recommending that schools use these carefully planned and sequenced lessons for children's learning from home.

We have suggested a daily routine for children to follow. We are also pleased to share with you the Oak National Academy weekly assembly and weekly collective worship for children to watch and join with.

The daily learning routine below is only a suggestion to help provide structure. You will decide what works for you in your home. We realise that the family will need to share laptops or mobiles, so only plan to do what you can. We recognise that parents may be working, caring for sick family members or looking after little ones, so choosing activities is up to you. The activities guide you and your child to be able to learn together or for your child to learn on their own. Parents are not expected to be teachers and these daily lessons are designed to keep children busy and enjoying learning, while providing flexibility for parents to run their household as they see fit.

We continue to provide a range of suggested additional activities which children may like to have a go at in addition to the daily lessons.
